8. Accreditation and control

These operations will be effected on 20-9-2019 (all the day) by the representatives of the USIP and the organizing committee at the championship Hotel Da Vinci.

9. Eligibility to start

The provisions laid down in the Statutes, the Rules and Regulations, the Competition Rules as well as the Anti-Doping Regulations of the USIP shall apply.

Article 23 USIP Statutes:

The Competitors

1. Participation in championships is restricted to athletes, who:
 - a. meet the starting requirements of their international union
 - b. belong to a national sports organization that is a member of the USIP
 - c. are police officers or students of a public police academy, and have reach the age of 18 at the time of the championships (including preliminary rounds)
 - d. and have signed the Anti-Doping Declaration.

2. The Rules and Regulations of the USIP specify the conditions for participation in competitions.

Article R 10 /2:

Competitors

1. In order to be able to take part in world championships organised by USIP, members of the member unions have to fulfil the following conditions:
 - a. fulfilment of the provisions set out in Article 23 of the Statutes;
 - b. status of police officers or students of a public police academy. The police shall be a number of bodies and institutions in charge of maintaining public law and order (administrative police and crime investigation departments).

2. Military police, members of the military, members of fire brigades and civil servants, not belonging to the police, shall be excluded from world police championships.



Sub-paragraph 1.5 of the USIP Competition Rules

1.5. Participation in the championships or games is restricted to athletes who:

- meet the starting requirements prepared by their respective international sports association,
- are members of a national police sports association that is a member of USIP,
- are police officers or students at public police academy and have reached the age of 18 at the time the championship takes place.

For verification of a person's eligibility, the presentation of the relevant documents may be required (verified copy). In case the subject matter documents are not delivered, the permission to start needs to be refused.

1.6. Sportsmen and women that participated in the military championships are not eligible to enter World Police Championships and World Games of Police Schools for 12 months following such military championships.

1.7. Competitors suspended from the sport contests by the respective sport association due to violation of the relevant doping regulations are not eligible to enter the competitions.

1.8. All teams shall wear uniform sportswear displaying the emblems of their individual member union.

10. Verification of eligibility to enter

- For verifying a contestant's eligibility to start, the production of his/her police ID, his/her passport/personal identity card as well the signed Anti-Doping-Declaration will be required.
- All participating countries have to bring the USIP Declaration of Participation for each athlete who will participate, signed by the respective President or Secretary General.
- The verification of eligibility will be effected by the representative of the USIP Technical Commission and a representative of the Organizing Committee.

11. Anti-Doping

Doping tests (urine and/or blood) will be conducted during the Championship, with the current WADA list of prohibited substances being applicable. (www.wada-ama.org).



Every Competitor must sign the USIP Anti-Doping-Declaration and hand it over to the USIP Technical Delegate and/ or the organization at the accreditation.

12. Referees

The organizing committee may enter as many referees as required for the good realisation of the USIP World Police Games.

13. Expenses/fees

- **13.1 Travelling expenses**

Each member union will defray its own travelling expenses.

- **13.2 Board and lodging**

- **Delegate**

The expenses of board and lodging for the delegation leader (Article R 16.1 of the USIP Rules and Regulations) of the respective member union will be paid by the organiser.

- **Team / Individuals**

For all participants **50,00 Euro** per person per night are to be paid to the organizer (Article R 12/3 of the USIP Rules and Regulations).

Board and lodging fee and participation/entry fee has to be paid in cash to the organizer on location at the championship hotel.

- **Guests**

Should a member union intend to take guests with them to the Championship and should the organiser be able to provide the respective accommodation, each guest shall pay the actual costs charged by the organiser.

Participation will be refused to a member organisation having failed to meet the payment

obligation of the entry/board and lodging fee.



- **USIP Registration fee**

Article R 12/2 of the USIP Rules and Regulations:

Prior to a championship each participating nation has to pay a registration fee to the General Treasurer of the USIP.

This fee has to be paid before the opening of the World Championship.

Each start single: **50,00 EURO per individual athlete**

Each start team: **200,00 EURO per Team**

The total amount of the registration fee should be paid in cash to the USIP General Treasurer / or his representative in Milan at the beginning of the USIP World Police Games. An invoice will be established after paying the registration fee .

Participation will be refused to a member organisation having failed to meet the payment obligation of the USIP Registration fee.

14. VISA

- **The organizer ASPMI shall issue visas for all participants who need visa to entry into Italy.**

The USIP and the ASPMI shall not assume any liability in the event of accidents, theft and other events of damage or loss.

The disclaimer shall be recognised upon registration for the event.

- *One contestant per team has to wear the police uniform of their respective country at the opening ceremony.*
- *All teams shall wear uniform sportswear displaying the emblem of their individual member union.*
- *All teams should bring their own National Anthem. (CD/DVD or Memory Stick)*
- *As to the Final/ Closing Banquet, you are requested to attend adequately dressed to suit the occasion (sports clothes and blue jeans are not welcomed!).*
- *The participating teams are responsible for the assurance of their delegation.*
- *The delegate is responsible of behaviour of his respective delegation during the World Championship (accommodation, sport event, ceremonies and official dinner).*

The Rules and Regulations of The 3rd USIP World Police Games Milan- Lombardia 2019

Article 1 - Venue

The Italian Police Sports Association (ASPMI) in collaboration with the International Police Sports Union (USIP), shall organize the 3rd USIP World Police Games in 19-26 September 2019 in Milan and other locations in Lombardia-Italy.

Article 2 - General Definitions

In implementing the provisions of these regulations, the following words and expressions shall have the meanings assigned there to here under unless the context otherwise specifies:

ASPMI: Italian Police Sports Association

USIP: International Police Sports Union

Games: the games approved for competition between countries

National Game Association: Italian associations of games approved by (Italian Swimming Federation, Italian Shooting Association, Italian Jiu-jitsu Federation, Italian Judo Federation and Italian Track and Field Federation)

National team: national team registered for participation in the championship

The 3rd USIP World Police Games: the team and individual games organized for the USIP member countries



Championship Director: the person overseeing the implementation and follow up of the championship's general program in line with the applicable regulations and guidelines

Championship Committees: the committees formed by ASPMI Higher Committee's decree in order to perform the duties related to the management and organization of championship

Article 3 - Championship Goals

1-Promote sport among all police forces worldwide, and foster positive relations between USIP member countries

2-Promote knowledge and awareness of sport in order to build a strong foundation for developing police sports

3-Provide opportunities for further developing friendly and professional relationships between police institutions world wide

4-Share knowledge, expertise, and get familiar with the best practices in police sport areas

5-Identify top police talents in all games and develop the physical performance and skills

6-Encourage competition among participants and foster friendly relationships between USIP member countries



Article 4 - Registration Process Time Table

- Form shall be submitted to the USIP on the dates shown in the timetable above
- Form submitted after the dates specified in the table above shall not be accepted unless the approval of USIP is obtained.
- Participation forms shall be send to Organizer and USIP email
- Forms will be available on both Championship and USIP websites



Article 5 - Players Registration

All participants must be registered in championship via the electronic system using the forms approved by the Organizing Committee. The following conditions shall apply:

- 1-Players must be staff members in the police force in their respective countries.
- 2-The minimum age of players is 18 years.
- 3-Documents proving registration (a name list approved by the participating country in addition to passport copies and personal photos for all delegation members) shall be presented.
- 4-Required information shall be sent at a time specified by the Organizing Committee.
- 5-The participating countries and delegations shall provide medical insurance to their respective participants. Participating countries shall be fully responsible for performing medical examination and for health, civilian and technical safety of their team members. The host country shall provide medical treatment in emergencies that may occur during participation in championship.
- 6-Players must hold the legal nationality of countries they represent.

Article 6 - Participant ID

- 1-All participants shall obtain identity cards issued by the Organizing Committee.
- 2-No player shall participate in games without presenting ID to referees.



Article 7 - Hosting Participation Delegation

Article 8 - General Program

1-The general program of Championship shall be developed following the approval of all participating teams.

Article 9 - Opening, Awarding and Closing Protocols

1-The USIP regulations and book on general rules and protocols of flag raising, opening and closing ceremonies, etc. shall apply.

2-The protocols of raising the flags of participating countries shall be performed before the opening ceremony and shall be specified in the schedule at a later time.

3-Flags of ITALY, USIP and the championship shall be raised one week at least prior to the championship in agreement with USIP and in line with the protocols of international championships.

4-Winning individuals and teams shall receive trophies and medals separately at the end of each game.

5-At the end, championship flag shall be handed over to the host of the next championship in the presence of the USIP President.

Article 11 – Technical Regulations of Games

1- Swimming (men and women):

- 1) Each country may have two swimmers in each individual race and a team in the relay race.
- 2) Championship shall follow the qualification system in line with championship schedule.
- 3) The top eight swimmers shall qualify to the finals.
- 4) Registration forms shall be handed over during the swimming technical meeting to be held prior to games' opening.
- 5) Forms for participation in relay race shall be submitted prior to contests.
- 6) The swimming pool required for championship shall be a 50-meter Olympic-size swimming pool with eight racing lanes.
- 7) In areas not covered by the above rules, the International Swimming Federation's rules shall apply.

4. Practical Shooting (men and women) IPSC Practical Shooting:

1) Approved games:

-Practical shooting for men

-Practical shooting for women

2) The results of each game shall be determined in accordance with IPSC rules.

3) Italian Shooting Association shall oversee the approved games under the supervision of USIP.

4) Level III match rating set out in IPSC rules shall be followed.

5) Championship shall have 10 shooting scenarios (stages) as per IPSC

Handgun Rules, 2016 Edition, applicable to IPSC international competitions.

6) The handgun production specifications shall apply to IPSC shooting competition.

7) Championship days shall be determined based on the numbers of participating players and teams.

8) In the event of a tie shoot-off, as per the international laws of the game, shall be followed.

9) Equipment, guns and ammunition shall be examined to ensure they meet IPSC rules.

10) Relevant forms shall be completed and submitted to allow the entry of guns and ammunition into Italy.

11) Games shall be overseen by USIP-approved referees and referees from Italian Shooting Association.

12) Approved scenarios shall be in line with IPSC rules.

There are specific USIP rules on weapons , equipment , gears and uniforms. Separate explanations with pictures shall be send separately.



5. 10k Street running

- 1) **Start line** : The departure is located near the Villa Reale located in the park of Monza.
- 2) **Route** : The route is an completely flat and asphalted road. Entirely closed to traffic and approved by the FIDAL (Italian National Federation Track and Field). It will be held in the Monza park and in the Monza National F1 Autodrome.
- 3) **Finish line** : The finish line is located on the straightway of the Monza National F1 Autodrome.
- 4) **Time limit** : The time limit is 90 minutes.
- 5) **Disqualifications** : The participation with a pectoral of another runner, the cession of the pectoral, route cuts or any other serious event that will be detected by the organization will cause the exclusion from the classification and the disqualification from the event.
- 6) **Timing and chip** : The timing service will be carried out by means of a microchip that allows to record the real time.
 - The chip is strictly personal and cannot be exchanged.
 - Participants must pass on special platforms prepared for the detection of the chip code. Competitors not transited on said platforms, or for which time will be recorded on the distance between a check point and the other judged by the FIDAL judges present at the untrusted event, will be disqualified.
 - The chip that will be delivered to each athlete shall have to arrange the chip to a position that it will be detectable.
 - The chip must be returned on arrival of the race.

6. Skeet/Trap

RACE AT 125 PLATES + FINAL (ISSF formula)

RIFLE CALIBER

During the competition it will not be possible to use a caliber different from the declared one.

DRAW

By 18.00 PM on the evening before the competition, a shoot will be drawn up to determine the firing order among the shooters who will have regularized the registration.

RULES OF CONDUCT RACE

The starting time of the competition will be announced the previous evening, with the draw drawn, and will be established by the Coordinator taking into account the number of participants.



QUALIFICATIONS

Will be performed on the distance of 125 plates for all.

FINALISTS:

At the end of the qualifications, starting from "Zero", the first 6 shooters (in case of parity, an ISSF shoot-off must be carried out), plus a possible play-off, only in case of a tie, to determine the first and second place in the standings .

The ranking of the first six will not be given on the basis of the last series or zero in the series but, with the same score, will be determined by the playoff.

SHOOT-OFF

The play-off starts among the highest scores in the standings.

the athletes who must perform the Shoot-off, must position themselves, in order of classification, behind the platform 1 and shoot a regular plate, in the following indicated: from the platform 1 a left plate, from the platform 2 a right plate, from the platform 3 a left, from the platform 4 a right-hand plate, from the platform 5 a left-hand plate and so on alternately, until the parity breaks.

FINAL

The finalists will occupy the 1 - 2 - 3 - 4 - 5 and 6 pegs depending on the number of their assigned pitch, as per the position obtained in qualifying or after the playoff. The shooter with the lowest backbone number (1) will start first from the platform 1. The remaining shooters will position themselves on the subsequent firing platforms on the basis of the numbers assigned to them and will shoot all of them to 25 targets.

At the end of the 25 plates, the 6th classified will be eliminated. In the event of an injury the shooter entered in the final with the highest backbone number will be eliminated.

The five remaining athletes will shoot at 5 other targets:

At the end of the 30 plates, the 5th classified will be eliminated. In the event of a tie, the shooter entered in the final with the highest backbone will be eliminated.

The remaining four athletes will shoot at 5 other targets.

At the end of the 35 plates, the 4th classified will be eliminated. In the event of a tie, the shooter entered in the final with the highest backbone will be eliminated.

The remaining three athletes will shoot at five other targets.

At the end of the 40 plates, the 3rd classified will have won the bronze medal. In the event of a tie, the shooter entered in the final with the highest backbone will be eliminated.

N.B.- The sequence of each passage of 5 plates will be: 2 left - 2 right and a central with random mode.

The remaining two athletes will shoot at 10 other targets.

At the end of the 50 plates, the gold and silver medals will be awarded.

In case of parity, you must proceed immediately to a shoot-off, according to the procedure indicated above.



N.B. - The sequence of 10 plates will be: 4 left - 4 right and 2 central with random mode.

At the end of each elimination series, the athletes will continue to occupy the initial position.

TRAP MIXED TEAM

TEAM

Every Country will be able to participate with 2 mixed Team – 1 man and 1 woman . The Teams must be declared during the Technical Meeting and will be not possible change. The best 6 Teams - composed of the final classification of the men's and women's competitions – will play the final series.

RIFLE CALIBER

at the time of enrollment, each shooter must declare by means of which caliber he intends to contest the competition and during the course it will not be possible to use a different one from the one previously declared.

FINAL

At the end of the qualifiers of the men and women single race, starting from "Zero", the first 6 shooters (in the event of an injury will have an ISSF shoot-off), will perform a final, 30 smoke bombs (15 plates), as follows:

the finalists, will occupy the 1 - 2 - 3 - 4 - 5 and 6 foot pegs depending on the number of shooting assigned to them, as per the position obtained in qualifying. The shooter with the lowest backbone number (1) will start first from the platform 1. The remaining shooters will position themselves on the subsequent firing platforms on the basis of the numbers assigned to them. At the end of the 15 doublets, the 6th classified will be eliminated. In the event of a tie, the shooter entered in the final will be eliminated with the lowest score (highest backbone).

The five remaining athletes will shoot five more doublets:

At the end of the 5 doubles, the 5th classified will be eliminated. In the event of a tie, the shooter entered in the final will be eliminated with the lowest score (highest backbone).

The 4 remaining athletes will shoot at another 5 doubles.

At the end of the 5 doublets, the 4th classified will be eliminated. In the event of a tie, the shooter entered in the final will be eliminated with the lowest score (highest backbone).

The remaining three athletes will shoot five more doublets.

At the end of the 5 doubles, the 3rd classified will have won the bronze medal. In the event of a tie, the shooter entered in the final will be eliminated with the lowest score (highest backbone).

The sequences of the 5 doubles will be: 2 doubles scheme A - 2 doubles scheme B) and 1 doublet scheme c) with random mode.

The 2 remaining athletes will shoot at another 10 doublets.

At the end of the 10 doublets, podiums for gold and silver medals will be awarded.

In case of parity, you must proceed immediately to a shoot-off.

The sequences of the 10 doublets will be: 4 doubles scheme A - 4 doubles scheme B) and 2



doubles scheme C) with random mode.

At the end of each elimination series, the athletes will return to occupy the initial position.

SHOOT-OFF

the athletes who will have to perform the Shoot-off, with the scheme C) must position themselves, in order of backbone (assigned to the six finalists), behind the platform 1 and shoot a regular doublet, if necessary, the shoot-off will continue, in sequence , from the platforms 2,3,4,5, up to the break of the parity.

7 . Cycling

Route

This race is organized inside of the Granfondo Bike Division and takes advantages of the full patronage and support of the City of Peschiera del Garda (VR), a town placed on Lake Garda – Veneto - that wants to invest on amateur cycling movement to promote sustainable mobility. Peschiera del Garda will provide all facilities: parking, places for the secretariat of the event, such as the delivery of the credits and race packet, and of course a unique location for the Expo area that will take place in the historical city centre. A great chance to discover territory full of culture, nature and fun.

Road traffic is closed. Anyway please respect and observe the Highway Code.

Start

The start of the race will be organized in grids – in the last edition there was 2.500 participants – for different level of participants.

The all participants at the Championship will be positioned in the first grid – men and women together – with a different colour number.

Timing

The timing service will be provided by SMS, the official distributor of the brand Winning Time. Each athlete will be provided with his own Winning Time Chip for ranking. It will be possible to use only the "Personal Winning Time Chip regularly "ACTIVATED" for the current season, or the



Daily Chip valid only for the event provided by our organization for all the athletes devoid. All other chips will not be working.

Technical supporting

Technical assistance will be organized during the race with special motorcycles who will have wheels and technical specialist. Will be present few fixed technical point in the route. Is not permitted on the route cars of the Countries participants.

The organization provides SAG vehicle for participants who need support and assistance along the way; cyclists have to wait for the vehicle when in need to get out of the route and reach the finish area.

Although not specified in the present, the technical regulations of UCI will be applied.

Article 12 Results

1-The results of each game shall be determined in accordance with the international laws of the game.

2-Results shall be handed over to Results and Statistics Committee following approval from Referees Committee and Technical Committee.

Article 13 Laws and Regulations of the Games

1-The international laws of the games shall apply.

2-USIP rules and regulations shall apply.

3-The games shall be managed by ASPMI associations under the supervision of relevant international associations.

Article 14 Anti-doping

Tests International and Olympic laws, as per procedures and conditions, together with relevant penalties and sanctions shall apply to all participants.



Article 15 Costumes/Dress code

- 1-Applicable swimming, Jiu-jitsu and Judo laws and rules shall apply.
- 2-Police uniform of the participating country shall be worn. IPSC rules on clothing shall apply.

Article 16 Visas and Entry Permits to Italy

- 1-ASPMI shall issue visas for all participants.
- 2-The participation of delegation members shall be approved after the security clearance for visa issuance purposes is obtained from the host country's competent security services (an issue beyond the mandate of the Organizing Committee) as per the laws of host country.
- 3-Obtaining the security permits for shipping guns across countries and airports shall be the responsibility of the participating countries.

Article 17 Referees and Refereeing

- 1-The championship events shall be overseen by international referees approved by Italian Swimming Federation, Italian Jiu-jitsu Federation, Italian Judo Federation and Italian Track and Field Federation.
- 2-For IPSC practical shooting, the main referees shall be seconded from USIP. Other referees shall be from Italian Shooting Association.
- 3-The international laws and rules of the games shall apply.

Article 18 Objection to Referee Decisions

- 1-Referee decisions may not be objected to during the game. Technical objections shall be officially submitted in writing to the Technical Committee by the administrator or coach no later than 30 minutes from the end of game.



2-Administrative objections shall be submitted in writing to championship director by the delegation chair no later than 24 hours from the end of game.

3-Objection fee of 200 euros shall apply.

4-The international laws of the games shall apply with regards to all objections.

Article 19 Trophies and Medals

1-Trophies and medals shall be awarded to winning players in all games in line with the international system i.e. by raising the flag of the third place winner, followed by second place winner then first place winner and playing the national anthem of first place winner.

2-Trophies and medals shall be awarded to the top three winning teams in each game following the approval of results at the time of their announcement.

3-The top three winning individual players shall receive the following:

- First place: Gold medal and trophy
- Second place: Silver medal
- Third place: Bronze medal

4-The top three winning teams shall receive the following:

- First place: first place trophy and gold medals for all team members
- Second place: second place trophy and silver medals for all team members
- Third place: third place trophy and bronze medals for all team members

Article 20 Championship Trophy

1-Championship trophy shall be awarded to the country with the biggest number of gold medals.

2-In case of equal number of gold medals, championship trophy shall be awarded to the country with the biggest number of silver medals.



3-In case of equal number of silver medals, championship trophy shall be awarded to the country with the biggest number of bronze medals.

Article 21 Delegation Accommodation

1- ASPMI shall host the number of participants set out in Article 7 above in the hotel selected by the Organizing Committee.

2-The participating countries shall shoulder accommodation and living costs of any additional participants (guests).

3-A special price shall be given in some hotels for such additional participants.

4-Hosting shall include hotel accommodation and three meals

5-Participants shall shoulder costs in excess of the above mentioned. (*see article 13.2 of the Invitation to Enter*)

Article 22 Arrival and Departure Dates

The arrival and departure dates and flight details of participating delegations shall be sent no later than 14 August 2019 via championship's approved forms to be communicated by the Organizing Committee.

Article 23 Reception and Transportation

1-ASPMI shall be responsible for receiving participating delegations at airport and facilitating relevant entry procedures.

2-ASPMI shall be responsible for securing transportation for all delegations.

3-ASPMI shall be responsible for facilitating the entry of guns and ammunition and their transportation into storing areas designated by relevant MOI department.

4-All the above procedures shall be carried out by the host country within its regional jurisdiction only.



Article 24 Stadiums, Halls and Shooting Ranges

1-Sport halls of swimming, Jiu-jitsu and Judo shall be selected by the competent committee in accordance with the international laws of the games.

2-Shooting ranges shall be prepared by the competent committee in accordance with IPSC law.

3-All facilities, halls and ranges shall be approved by USIP Technical Committee.

Article 25 Championship Website

1-The championship website shall be the main platform for communication and sharing information and official results of championship.

2-The website shall contain all information on championship to include laws, rules, instructions, regulations, guidelines, and registration e-forms.

Article 26 General Provisions

1-All participants shall demonstrate sound sport ethics and shall abide by the International Olympic Committee's Charter on the spirit of fair play.

2-Participating countries, not the host country, shall be responsible for providing equipment, tools, clothing, numbering, guns, ammunition, and all supplies needed for players or shooters.

3-The participating delegations and countries shall be responsible for the actions of their representatives during the championship.

4-The Organizing Committee may introduce any changes it sees appropriate.

5-The host country shall prepare stadiums and halls and shall provide necessary sporting equipment for the championship.

6-Each team shall present the registration form of every contest.

7-Each team shall wear a uniform representing its respective country and no other uniform representing any other body may be worn.



8-Results and Statistics Committee shall communicate all results to all participating delegations and countries.
