17th USPE European Police Championships in Judo 10th – 13th May 2015 in Dresden/Germany

Invitation to Enter

The German Police Sport Federation (Deutsches Polizeisportkuratorium; DPSK) was entrusted by the Union Sportive des Polices d'Europe (USPE) with the organization of the 17th USPE European Police Championships in Judo from 10th – 13th May 2015 in Dresden/Germany.

The following invitation to enter is issued for the USPE EPC in Judo 2015.

The organizer will provide the transportation from Airport/Train station Dresden to the hotel according the travelling details of all the delegations.

Delegations which need a VISA are requested to contact the host in time.

6. **Competition rules**

6.1 The provisions of the USPE Competition Rules, paragraph 4.5, shall apply.

4.5 **Judo**

4.5.1 The rules and regulations laid down by the International Judo Federation (IJF) shall apply, unless otherwise stipulated below or provided for in the invitation to enter.

4.5.2 In agreement with the organizer and the Secretary General, the responsible member of the USPE Technical Commission determines the weight categories for the EPC.

4.5.3 Each member union may only nominate one female/male competitor per weight category.

Up to four attendants may be nominated. However, the number of attendants must not exceed the number of sportsmen/-women.

In agreement with the Secretary General, the responsible member of the USPE Technical Commission decides which member unions have to send IJF-referees to the final round.

6.2 Weight categories

The categories to be contested are:

Women: -48kg, -52kg, -57kg, -63kg, -70kg, -78kg, +78kg

Men: -60kg, -66kg, -73kg, -81kg, -90kg, -100kg, +100kg

Each member union may enter up one competitor per weight category.

6.3 Competition formula

The competition will be hold on double k. o. system with semi-finals and finals on the same day. There will be two bronze medallists.

In weight categories with up to 5 participants everyone is fighting against everyone.

6.4 Draw

The draw will take place on 10th May 2015 after the Technical Meeting.

6.5 Duration of the contest

The duration of each contest will be 5 minutes (female and male). In case of equality, golden score according to the IJF Rules will be apply.

6.6 Weigh in

Weighting is on the day before the competition

Official weigh in on Sunday 10th May 2015: between 19.00 and 21.00.

Official weigh in on Monday 11th May 2015: between 16.00 and 17.00

The fighters, which are not present during the official weigh in, cannot participate at the competition.

6.7 Judogi

The competitors shall wear a Judogi as following conditions according to the IJF Rules:

Blue for the first contestant and white or off-white for the second contestant.

Back numbers:

The Back numbers will be delivered by the organizer and be put on the judogi after the accreditation.

6.8 Dress code

The coaches will wear:

Preliminaries: national official track with trousers reaching down the shoes,

Finals (semi-final and final): jacket suit and tie

7. Referees

The provisions of the USPE Competition Rules, paragraph 2.4, shall apply.

The EJU will support the EPC Judo 2015 by sending 6 EJU Referees.

Each country may enter one referee with international licence A or B registered in the referees' classification of the European Judo Union (EJU).

The decision on additional referees shall be taken by the Secretary General and the competent member of the Technical Committee.

9. Jury of appeal

The provisions of the USPE Rules and Regulations, Article R 19, shall apply.

The Jury of Appeal for the USPE EPC Judo is comprised of:

1. Fred Kusserow, Secretary General of the USPE, Chairmen
2. Eric Zancanaro, Member of the USPE Technical Commission
3. Uwe Kilz, HoM
4. Bernd Hermann, Chief of competition

All appeals have to be made in writing by the delegate or one of the attendants of the member union in question within less than an hour after the end of the fixing of or the publication of the results unless the respective international sport rules specify different.

The delegate or one of the attendants of the member union has to enclose an appeal fee with the appeal in order for the appeal to be valid.

The deposited sum will be refunded to its owner if the appeal proves to be justified. If the appeal is rejected the sum deposited is retained by the USPE.

The appeal fee will be a total of 100,00 EUR, paid in cash.

10. Eligibility to start

The provisions of the USPE Statutes, the USPE Rules and Regulations, the USPE Competition Rules as well as the USPE Anti-Doping Regulations shall apply.

USPE Statutes Article 23: The Competitors

(1) Participation in championships is restricted to athletes, who:

1. meet the starting requirements of their international union,
2. belong to a national sports organisation that is a member of the USPE,
3. are police officers or
4. are police students at a public police academy,
5. have reached the age of 18 at the time of the championships (including preliminary rounds),
6. have signed the Anti-Doping Declaration,
7. and submit the USPE Declaration of Participation signed by the respective President/Secretary General to the competent member of the Technical Commission.

USPE Rules and Regulations Article R 12/2: Competitors

- (1) In order to be able to take part in a European championship organised by the USPE, the members of the member unions have to fulfil the following conditions:
 1. They have to satisfy the provisions set out in Article 23 of the Statutes.
 2. They have to be police officers or students at a public police academy. The police are a set of all bodies and institutions in charge of maintenance of public law and order (administrative police and crime investigation departments).
- (2) Military police, members of the military, members of the fire brigades and civil servants that do not belong to the police are excluded from European police championships.

USPE Competition Rules paragraph 1.3.2:

Competitors suspended from sports contests by the USPE or by the respective sports association due to having violated the relevant doping regulations are not eligible to enter.

USPE Competition Rules paragraph 1.5:

All teams shall wear uniform sportswear displaying the emblems of their individual member union.

11. Accreditation/Verification of eligibility to enter

For verification of a person's eligibility, the presentation of the police ID and passport or national ID-card (including a photo) must be presented to the Technical Delegate of the USPE. In case these documents are not presented, permission to start could be refused.

According to the USPE Statutes, all participating countries must present the USPE Declaration of Participation for each athlete who will participate, signed by the respective President or Secretary General.

Without the Declaration the participation at the USPE EPC is not possible!

The verification will be effected by the competent member of the USPE Technical Commission, Mr. Eric Zancanaro.

12. Anti Doping

Doping tests (urine and/or blood) will be conducted during the championships, with the current WADA list of prohibited substances being applicable. (www.wada-ama.org).

Every Competitor must sign the USPE Anti-Doping-Declaration and hand it over to the USPE Technical Delegate at the accreditation.

Without the Declaration the participation at the USPE EPC is not possible!

13. Expenses/fees

13.1. Travelling expenses

Each member union will pay its own travelling expenses.

13.2. Board and lodging

Delegate

The expenses incurred by the delegate (USPE Rules and Regulations Article R 11) of the respective member union will be paid by the organizer.

Team

For all participants 40,00 € per person per night are to be paid to the organizer (Article R 14/3 of the Rules and Regulations).

Guests

Should a member country intend to take guests with them and should the organiser be able to provide the respective accommodation, each guest has to pay the actual costs incurred by them.

The costs for guests will be as follows:

Single room per day, including meals and VIP-Program: 150,- €.

Double room per day, including meals and VIP-Program: 120,- €.

The respective invoices will be sent by the organizer.

13. 3. Registration fee

USPE Rules and Regulations Article R 14/2:

Prior to a championship each participating nation has to pay a registration fee to the General Treasurer of the USPE.

This fee has to be paid before the opening of the championships.

Registration fees:

Each start (single/team): 40,-€

The respective invoices will be sent to the participating member countries in time by the USPE.

16. Disclaimer

The USPE and German Police Sport Federation shall not assume any liability in the event of accidents, theft and other events of damage or loss.

The disclaimer shall be recognised upon registration for the event.

17. Notes

One contestant per team has to wear the police uniform of their respective country at the opening ceremony.

All teams shall wear uniform sportswear displaying the emblem of their individual member union.

As to the Final Banquet, you are requested to attend adequately dressed to suit the occasion (no blue Jeans).

The participating teams are responsible for the assurance of their delegation.
